Communication, Language & Literacy


- Demonstrate an understanding of the text and create alternative versions.
- Leave consistent spacing between words.
- Write in different forms with simple text type features.
- Spell words containing each of the 40+ phonemes already taught.
- Continue to learn to read and spell the Year 1 key words.
- Form lower-case letters in the correct direction, starting and finishing in the right place.
- Use capital letters and full stops correctly.
- Read contractions, such as I'm and don't.
- Read their writing back and edit their work.
- Spell es and s plural words. Such as in churches and shadows.
- Learn the ve spelling rule, knowing ve comes at the end of words such as brave.
- Read and spell words the contain the est, ed and ing suffix.
 Such as in-fastest, painted and singing.

Mathematical Understanding

- Multiplication and division
- Half and double amounts.
- Half and quarter shapes.
- Solve one-step problems by calculating the answer using concrete objects, pictorial representations and arrays with the support of the teacher.
- Measure and record lengths, heights, weight and capacity.
- Sequence events in order, and tell the time to the hour and half hour.
- Count in multiples of 2, 5 and 10.

Understanding Physical Health and Wellbeing

- Hand-eye Co-ordination.
- Stop a ball using hands or feet.
- Throw an object with one hand.
- Athletics skills.
- Learn about special relationships family, friendships, people who help us

- Use their voices expressively and creatively by singing songs and speaking chants and rhymes.

Reading Books

Reading at home is so important to help the children build on those skills they have been taught at school and what better way is there to learn than when they are finding it so pleasurable.

You child has two books:

- A reading practice book Collins Big Cat (this book says Little Wandle on the cover) This book has been carefully chosen and matched to your child's phonetic ability and will be at the correct phonic stage for your child. They should be able to read this fluently and independently. We encourage children to read this book three times.
- A sharing book. Your child may not be able to read this book on their own as it is not fully decodable and may not match their exact phonics level. This book is for you both to read and enjoy together.

Phonics

This term your child will be embedding all the phoneme grapheme correspondence they have been taught, in preparation for the Year 1 Phonics Screening Check, which will take place in June. This check consists of 40 words, 20 real and 20 nonsense. All the information provided at the Year 1 Phonics Screening Meeting can be found on our school website.

The websites below are great for providing a mixture of real and nonsense words, and some of the games are free. The expected Phase for this check is that the children are working at Phase 5. However, if your child is on a Phase 3 or 4 reading book please select these games.

Maybe at times they would like a challenge of the Phase 5 games.
