- To begin to create their own stories.

### Mathematics

- To be able to count, write, compare and order numbers to 20 and beyond.
- To recognise and describe 3D shapes, such as cone, cube, sphere, cylinder and cuboid.
- To be able to add and subtract by counting on and back.
- To be able to solve practical problems, involving adding, subtracting, doubling and halving.
- To compare different measures.

### Understanding the World

- To find similarities and differences between their own environment and others.
- To recognise different animal homes.
- To know why it is important to care for animals and their environments.
- To give instructions to a programmable toy to move one place to another.
- To complete a simple program on the computer.
- To recognise different types of technology.

### Expressive Arts and Design
