- To recognise, name and describe circles, squares and rectangles.


#### Understanding the Arts and Design

## **Reading Books**

Reading at home is so important to help the children build on those skills they have been taught at school and what better way to learn when they are finding it so pleasurable. Please sign your child's reading record when you have listened to them read at home.

You child has two books:

- A picture book This book just has pictures and gives your child the opportunity to develop their language skills, by talking about the pictures and making up their own story.
- A Sharing book This book has some words but you child might not be able to read the words at the moment. It is for you to share with your child.

As your child's phonics skills develop we will move your child onto these two books:

A reading practice book -Collins Big Cat (this book says Little Wandle on the cover)

- This book has been carefully chosen and matched to your child's phonetic ability and will be at the correct phonic stage for your child. They should be able to read this fluently and independently. We encourage children to read this book three times.
- A sharing book. Your child may not be able to read this book on their own as it is not fully decodable and may not match their exact phonics level. This book is for you both to read and enjoy together.
